Report on the State of the Organisation

15 December 2025

“Men make their own history, but they do not make it as they please; they do not make it under self-selected circumstances, but under circumstances existing already, given and transmitted from the past. The tradition of all dead generations weighs like a nightmare on the brains of the living. And just as they seem to be occupied with revolutionizing themselves and things, creating something that did not exist before, precisely in such epochs of revolutionary crisis they anxiously conjure up the spirits of the past to their service, borrowing from them names, battle slogans, and costumes in order to present this new scene in world history in time-honoured disguise and borrowed language.”

- 1.1. This report is an overview of the state of the organisation since the 26th National Congress in July 2023.
- 1.2. It is also a platform that serves as the Highest Political School of the ANCYL while in the same parallel, we table an Organisational Report covering the two and a half years in office to the Plenary of the 27th National Congress.
- 1.3. This Organisational Report is a politico-organisational account of the ANCYL rebuilding process since our election in July 2023, which marks the mid-term of 2 years in four-year term of office after the National Congress resolved to move the term of office of the NEC from 3 years to 4 years.
- 1.4. The second historic NGC of the ANCYL made an assessment of the progress made and challenges encountered by the ANCYL, our movement, our country, the continent and the international community.
- 1.5. The 26th NEC was also seized with the responsibility to outline the major tasks of the ANCYL and our movement in the period ahead of us, we are all aware that we are a 40% party in electoral support, the ANCYL has a major task to rebuild itself to be a strong formidable force that is unavoidable, but also to rebuild the ANC and the broad movement against all forms of decay, it is facing.
- 1.6. The 2nd NGC assessed progress made against the strategic objectives of the ANCYL, which are mainly the twin-tasks of the ANCYL. The NGC also assessed and reviewed the relevancy of our policy truss against the changing political, cultural, ideological, social and economic environment within which we conduct our revolution.
- 1.7. The 26th National Congress was a historical milestone for the movement as a whole, as it saw an end to nearly a decade of interim structures. Though the 26th National Congress, like all Youth League Congresses was marked by interest on leadership question, it was never a major issue of Congress.
- 1.8. The 26th National Congress was imbued with quest for Radical Policy Shift; as such it emerged with the continuum of the demand for Radical shift in the Social and Economic Policy of the ANC and Government in South Africa and the Rest of the Continent. henceforth the Congress was marked by a dynamic continuum of the generational mission of Economic Freedom adopted by the 24th National congress of the ANCYL.



- 1.9. The 26th National Congress demanded key interventions in the following key Economic and Political areas:
- Acceleration of Import Substitution Industrialisation.
 - Introduction of Export Ban or Quotas for Critical Raw Materials and metals.
 - Reviewal of the Industrial, Macro and Micro Economic policy.
 - Strategic Nationalisation for Industrialisation.
 - Expropriation without compensation for socialization.
 - Prioritisation of Political Education and Ideological training in the rank and file of the ANCYL.
 - Land reform and land tenure rights.
- 1.10. On organisational interventions the 26th National congress introduced a new official position of the 2nd Deputy Secretary General, who is now responsible for Policy, Monitoring, Research and Evaluation. The 26th National Congress amended the term of office for the NEC to be four years, the PEC term of office to thirty-months and the REC term of office to two years. Congress resolved that all branches should establish Voting-District (VD) based sub-branches. Congress further noted the need for a strong and united PYA to advance the interests and aspirations of young South Africans and must have regular joint meetings and campaigns.
- 1.11. There is a need for a comprehensive renewal of the ANCYL as an organisation, in order to restore its relevance, vibrancy and effectiveness in championing the interests of young people. The ANC Youth League is on a right course to revive itself after almost a decade of absence and infiltration by counter- revolutionary elements.
- 1.12. Over the past fifteen years, the ANCYL faced significant challenges of infiltration, comrade buying, ideological distortion, and political diversion to deliberately disconnect it from the broader youth populace through false portrayal of wealth, meanwhile everyone is aware of your social status or class position as long as there is a funder regardless of their goal to undermine the revolution's cause.
- 1.13. In affirmation with African Claims of 1948, which alluded that *"The struggle is on right now and it must be persistent and insistent. In a mass liberation movement, there is no room for divisions or for personal ambitions. The goal is one, namely, freedom for all."* As the ANC Youth League, we also allude that the goal is Economic Freedom and Social Change, now and not later.
- 1.14. Therefore, embarking on massive political education and ideological training within the ranks of our organisation, will serve a renewal mechanism in order to develop a well-informed and politically conscious cadre of the youth league. It will also be important for the ANCYL to enhance the capacity and skills of its leaders and members through targeted leadership development programmes, mentorship initiatives and the promotion of ethical and effective organisational practices.
- 1.15. The ANCYL resolved to initiate a comprehensive review of the ANCYLs structures, constitution and organisational processes in order to identify areas of weaknesses, streamline decision-making processes and ensure efficient and accountable functioning. The Congress resolved that the NEC must establish an ANCYL Research and Policy Institute, which will provide a platform for the ANCYL to conduct research and develop policies that address the specific needs and concerns of the youth in South Africa.



1.16. As we celebrated and commemorate the 70th Anniversary of the Freedom Charter on the 25th of June 2025 which was adopted at the Congress of the People at Kliptown, Johannesburg in 1955. This document outlines a vision for a non-racial, democratic South Africa where all citizens have equal rights and opportunities. The Charter's core principle is that "South Africa belongs to all who live in it, black and white" and calls for a society based on equality, justice, and human dignity.

1.17. The Freedom Charter remains a living document and not just a vision of the past, but a battle plan for the future. As ANCYL, we recommit ourselves to the struggle to realise its demands in full, with a renewed sense of urgency, militancy and clarity.

1.18. The following are clauses found on the Freedom Charter:

- The People Shall Govern;
- All National Groups Shall Have Equal Rights;
- The People Share in the Country's Wealth;
- The Land Shall Be Shared Among Those Who work It;
- All Shall Be Equal Before the Law;
- There Shall Be Work and Security;
- The Doors of Learning and Culture Shall Be Open;
- There Shall Be Houses, Security and Comfort;
- There Shall Be Peace and Friendship; and,
- There Shall Be Freedom of Speech, Assembly and Association.

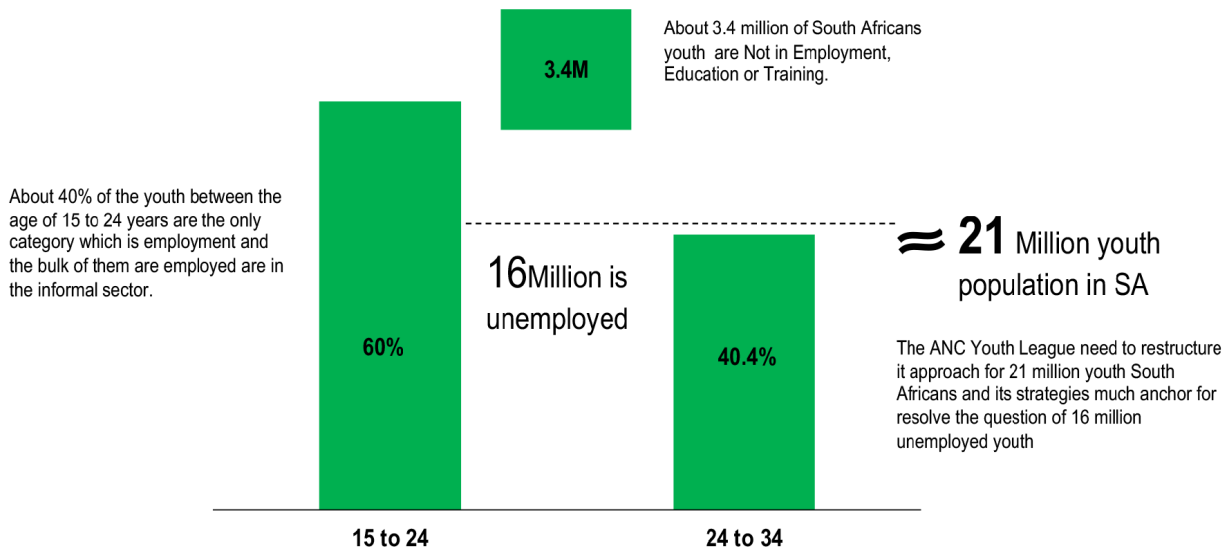
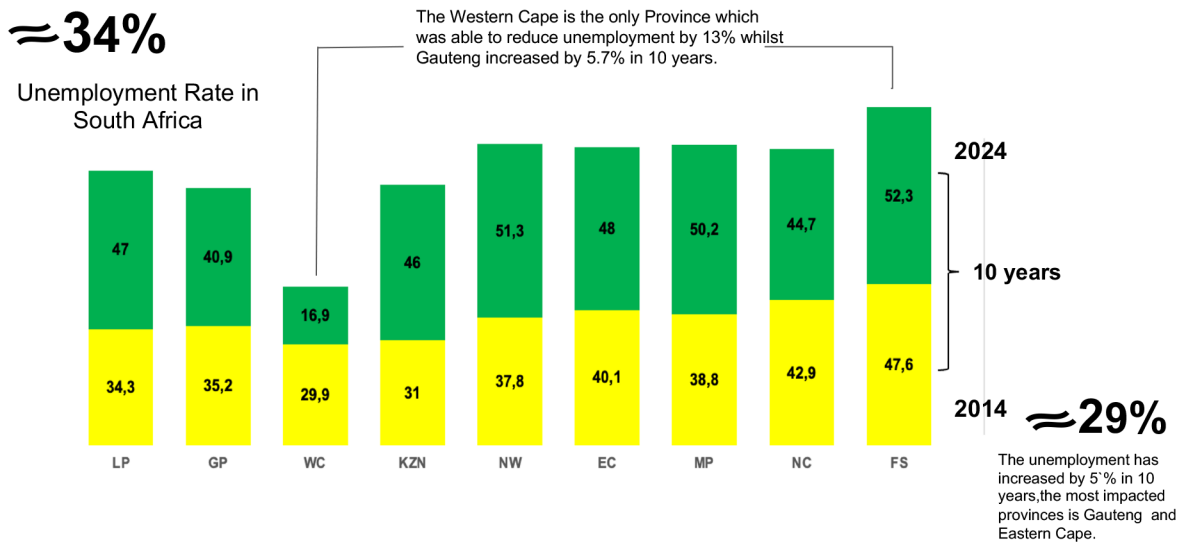
1.19. Each of its clauses speaks directly to the realities we face today. We honour this moment not through slogans, but through reflection, mobilisation and action. Having pragmatic programmes and campaigns around these areas will take us closer to the ideal of a South Africa that our forebears dreamed of seventy years ago. The Freedom Charter remains the guiding programme of the ANC Youth League and the National Congress resolutely reaffirm and reassert our unwavering allegiance to the immortal principles enshrined within the hallowed pages of the Freedom Charter. This sacred covenant remains the compass that directs our path towards Economic Freedom in our lifetime.

1.20. The organisation and movement at large requires disciplined, intellectual, militant and politically conscious leaders who are committed to achieve fundamental social change for the benefit of all young people and the working class. With that said, what then is the state of organisation since the 24th National Congress and the 2nd National General Council?



1.21. Below is the painful statistics of the bloated youth unemployment, presenting a picture as though we are a country at war. This is why comrades we must know that young people in our country are pinning their hopes and aspirations in the ANCYL to change this painful picture of a generation that is going to waste. Out of school, out of work during its prime time in their lives.

2.2. PART 2: STATE OF ORGANISATION

- 2.1. The 26th National Congress was held on the 30th of June to the 02nd of July 2023 at the Nasrec Expo Centre, Johannesburg, Gauteng under the theme: “**Economic Freedom and Social Change, Now and Not Later**”. The National Congress emphasised the need for radical and transformative economic policies that address the structural inequalities inherited from apartheid. We cannot secure true freedom and social change if we do not challenge the status quo and rectify the injustices of the past. We have to rise as the frontline troopers of the Liberation Movement with unyielding determination to champion the cause of our people.
- 2.2. National Congress elected a collective into the NEC with the responsibility to lead the organisation and implement its resolutions for the next four years.

- 2.3. Since Nasrec, the following developments impacted on the composition as elected by Congress:
- The following comrades were co-opted onto the NEC:
 - RAKOSA, Kutloano
 - SAPO, Balungile
 - DEWET, Babiki
 - Cde Bethuel Zunguza resigned from the NEC and was later elected as the Provincial Chairperson of the Provincial Executive Committee (PEC) in Mpumalanga.
- 2.4. At its first meeting, in July 2023, the National Executive Committee elected the National Working Committee as per the Constitutional requirements. The functioning of the NEC and NWC will be dealt with in Part Four.

Organisational Challenges and Priorities from Nasrec

- 2.5. The Organisational Report to the 26th National Congress indicated that the ANCYL is currently in a stage of rebuilding and renewing its structures. For us, the rebuilding process entails two fundamental aspects: the autonomy of the ANC Youth League and positioning the ANC Youth League to be the voice of the youth of South Africa. More importantly, it aims to capture the imagination of our masses and simply reimagine our society under the premise of the National Democratic Revolution (NDR). The NDR serves as the foundation of our ideological posture as the ANC Youth League and the ANC. It is important that we operationalize it to fit the context of our society in the 21st century and provide the line of march for the future of our society. In other words, we must place the NDR at the centre of the current social formation.
- 2.6. In order to address the challenges identified, Congress resolved to urge all ANC YL structures and members to fully commit to the renewal process, and to actively participate in the rebuilding and reinvigorating of the organisation, in order to realise its full potential as a powerful force for the empowerment and transformation of South Africa's youth.
- 2.7. The ANC Youth League NEC was committed to tackling and addressing challenges that hinder organisational renewal, such as corruption and factionalism. Strict accountability measures were implemented through the Political Management meetings, and transparency will be promoted in decision-making processes.
- 2.8. The ANC Youth League must work towards creating an environment that fosters unity, cohesion, and constructive dialogue. Again, a measure such as the Political Management was put in place to address any divisions or factions within the organisation and promote a culture of collaboration and respect.



2.9. Congress therefore instructed the National Executive Committee to lead a sustained and thorough-going programme of organisational renewal around the following organisational priorities:

- That a branch of the ANC YL should serve as the basic unit of grassroots mobilisation, education, and activism. It should be a platform for empowering youth members to actively engage in political discourse and contribute towards the achievement of the ANC YL's objectives.
- Leading and improving the capacity of the organisation including its capacity for mass mobilisation, political education and cadre development, political management of governance, policy formulation, management of international relations, instilling discipline and ethical conduct, funding the movement, and modernisation.
- Prioritise political education and ideological development within the ANCYL, emphasising the need for a comprehensive and structured curriculum that equips members with a sound understanding of the ANC's principles, values and policies; and
- Building a united and cohesive organisation that can unite, organise and champion the interests of the young people of South Africa.

2.10. This Organisational Report is an account by the National Executive Committee of how far it has progressed in implementing these instructions and resolutions of Congress.

An Active and Politically Conscious Membership

2.11. An active and politically conscious membership is important to the continued existence of the ANCYL as the preparatory school of the ANC and the biggest youth organisation on the African continent.

2.12. In terms of implementation of the above resolution, we can report on the following:

Membership Growth since Nasrec

2.14. The total membership as of August 2025, currently stood at **366 393**

2.15. To achieve high performance and competitive advantage, the organization needs to facilitate a through process of organizational development and renewal and this will be achieved by aligning structural, cultural and strategic realities of the organisation to respond to the needs of an ever-evolving political climate.

2.16. The ANCYL needs to develop numerous membership systems that will align with 4IR and make it easy for its members to renew their membership in a quick and user-friendly manner.

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3.3. PART 3: 2024 NATIONAL AND PROVINCIAL ELECTIONS

ANCYL National Elections Strategy Workshop and Implementation Plan

- 3.1. In an effort to prepare for the 2024 elections, the ANCYL 26th National Executive Committee convened an ANCYL National Elections Strategy Workshop and Implementation Plan from the 10th -11th of August 2023 at the Little Tuscany Boutique Hotel in Bryanston which focused mainly on the SRC Elections and the 2024 National and Provincial Elections. The workshop was attended by the working committees of following PYA structures: YCLSA, COSATU YW and SASCO who were also tasked to make presentations on their elections Programme of Action.
- 3.2. The workshop managed to develop a comprehensive elections programme which we were using to target all sectors of society for the 2024 National and Provincial Elections and working closely with the PYA in institutions of higher learning and COSAS in high schools.
- 3.3. The Elections Subcommittee has managed to convene workshops in seven provinces namely: KwaZulu Natal, Free State, Mpumalanga, Eastern Cape, North West, Gauteng and Limpopo.
- 3.4. The 2024 NPE Elections have come and gone. The 2024 national elections recorded a significantly lower voter turnout of 58.64%, of the 27.67 million registered voters, 17.7% accounted for voters under the age of 30. This was a lower turnout compared to the 2019 elections that had 21%.
- 3.5. As voter turnout continues to decline (especially amongst the youth) as the ANC Youth League we need to rethink our campaigning strategy and move away from the traditional methods of canvassing and come up with new ideas to attract the youth through massive investment in digital technology (such as AI tools and use of big data) and social media platforms.
- 3.6. The 2024 elections campaign was a tall order for the ANC, its leagues and the alliance in its entirety. As a result, the ANCs electoral support declined to 40.2 percent, which is the lowest share of votes recorded since the introduction of the country's first democratic election in 1994.
- 3.7. From the 2024 elections the ANCYL is pleased with the inclusion of young leaders in both the National Assembly and Provincial Legislatures and within National Government.
